

The Officers and Members of the Sheffield Volunteer Fire Brigade are writing to you to see if your Club or group would be interested in coming along and supporting our Wheels and Wings fund raising event.

All the money raised from this event goes to the Sheffield Volunteer Fire Brigade and the Malvern Order of St John Ambulance and other local organisations.

We will have planes from the Tiger Moth era to the present. Also present will be Gliders, Helicopters, Homebuilt air craft and maybe a hot air balloon weather dependant.
