USA. Southern states review

Following our great trip four years ago over Route 66, and now that Air NZ fly direct to Houston we decided to check out the southern states this year leaving on May 5th. With just over three weeks away we managed to fit in:-

- Visiting 8 states, Texas, Illinois, Mississippi, Arkansas, Tennessee, Nth. Carolina, Georgia, and Florida.
- Staying in 10 cities, Houston, New Orleans, Jackson, Memphis, Nashville, Pigeon Forge,
 Chattanooga, Atlanta, Orlando, and Miami.
- Driving 4,000km. on the wrong side of the road
- Walking around 300,000 steps
- Taking 2800 photos
- Eating heaps of great southern food
- Listing to fabulous music

Driving in the USA is a challenge, but with a great co-pilot, and a good GPS it is possible. Diving from city to city is reasonably straight forward as motorways as we know them are everywhere, the main difference here is the speed the traffic flows at. The highest legal maximum speed we saw was 75 MPH, at this stage I was driving at 85 MPH, and was the slowest car on the road! Even the trucks and buses seem to have little or no regard for the speed limit. In general the traffic will keep to the slower lanes unless passing, but some of the passing was rather dangerous and often indicators must have been broken!

When you get to the cities the driving becomes more difficult, we saw up to nine lanes (in each direction) combined with high volume of traffic at considerable speed, this is a challenge. Needless to say, in the short time we were there we did see several accidents, no real surprise.

For us, trip highlights included two of our bucket list destinations, Gracelands and Dollywood. Both of these had impressive collections of classic cars, great music and many other attractions. For those who don't know, Gracelands is like a museum and a real step back in time. The original homestead has been well maintained and kept as a real showpiece. I was surprised how many people were visiting and how well organised and professional the whole experience was. In Memphis, the home of Gracelands, Sun Recording Studios was an historical stop as this is where many of the greatest artists made their start ie. Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash. Beal St., is to Memphis what Bourbon St., is to New Orleans, and in both these places the bars, food and music just oozed out onto the street providing an atmosphere that is as legendary as it is amazing. At night both these streets become pedestrian areas well patrolled by local police.

Pigeon Forge, nestled in the Smokey Mountains is home to Dollywood, a Disneyland styled country theme / entertainment park established and run by Dolly Parton. I think the biggest surprise here was the size of the park and we certainly needed more than a day to do it all justice. The roller coasters were as frightening as anything we saw in Disneyland or Universal Studios, (no we did not go on them) the musical entertainment was diverse and extremely professional, and the food, and the food, yes and the food WOW!!!

Another main highlight of the trip was a night at The Grand Ole Opry where after hearing Angelina Presley sing we were able to meet her and get her to sign her newly released CD. She is a third cousin to Elvis.
