Since the earthquake, the parade route has been changed frequently and since 2014 has been renamed, The Twin Rivers Motoring Extravaganza, to encompassing all forms of transport and interesting vehicles including electric cars and machinery. The event started in 1998, initially organised by The Classic Car Motoring Society. From 2004 the Avonhead Rotary Club has taken it on-board as a charity fund raising event, and since then the Rotary Club has raised \$160,000 for various charities. This year the charity is the Canterbury Charity Hospital.
