# Club Member's Blurb of the Month

# Christine & Peter Craig - 1959 Saratoga

Since moving to Diamond Harbour 10 months ago from the Kapiti Coast in the North Island the Saratoga has had little use and this needs to change so it's time to put some miles under her. We imported "Sara" (As she's become known - or the Saratowcar as she's known to some!) around 10 years ago from Missouri, just outside of St Louis - little is known of her history stateside apart from that she seems to have spent quite a bit of time in the Ozarks.

We were looking for a late 60's Roadrunner, Plymouth GTX or a Charger at the time when Sara burst onto the screen during one of our many long searches. I've always had a soft spot for the big Mopar "Finnies" so she pretty quickly caught my eye and these things are not that easy to come by any more. The Saratoga was for sale through a dealer and 20 Hi Res pics had me seduced and many phone calls followed at all hours to get the process moving. An appraisal was commissioned which showed her to be in very sound condition (yeah right) - more on that later and the help of Steve Curl, a NZ expat from Kiwi Shipping was enlisted to handle all things stateside. This was our first foray into a purchase out of the U.S and we were as green as it gets - thank God for Steve's help as a pretty big chunk of Kiwi cash disappeared into the American banking ethers and it took Steve several days and a number of visits to said bank to locate it again - sleepless nights! - don't even go there!!!

After a few weeks the Saratoga was loaded onto another Kiwi expats slider and transported to Long Beach California, after another interminable period she finally arrived at the holding warehouse in Seaview Wellington which rekindled another huge wash of emotions. When I called at the yard full of excited expectation to see what we had bought we had an emotional roller coaster on our hands. She was sitting on her front brake hubs at the front of a 40 foot container with another car loaded on top of her on wooden ramps and 2 other cars behind her -- looking pretty filthy and sad. Getting her out was a nightmare and they nearly dragged her 2 meter long fins down the side of the container - when she was out and wheels put on things improved a little however when we filled the radiator to fire her up the water ran out the side of the block as fast as it went in - rusted welsh plug - Arghhh!!. Anyway, got her home and gave her a wash and a tidy and the diamond in the rough began to show. A quick check over and it became very evident very quickly that rust means very little to the Americans - it seems that if it looks great from 10 feet -it is. Both front foot wells were rusted as was the trunk floor, all triple skin with no replacement panels available - most body mounts were also rusted. Several guotes were sourced to repair these panels and ranged from reasonable to utterly ridiculous. Enter John Cam - John runs a restoration shop on the Kapiti Coast - Mustang Restorations - and had me take the Chrysler home and over the 3 weeks I got off at Christmas I spent every day under the Saratoga on jack stands and removed every scrap of factory underseal with a heat gun and scraper and hand sanded / scraped all under pinnings, same for the interior, everything came out apart from the dash and headlining and a relatively naked body was handed back to john who set about bringing her back to life. John did an incredible job of hand fabricating panels and we are eternally grateful for his work so I now know every square inch of her from front to back in and out and she is totally rust free - no mean feat for a late 50's Mopar!!!!

Mechanically the Saratoga was pretty good apart from a cracked rear brake drum, rusty frost plugs and sloppy tuning so she quickly responded to some mechanical love and understanding –

I swear she has a mechanical soul and is grateful for all her TLC having rewarded us with years now of absolutely trouble free and incredibly willing performance, easily the best classic car we've ever owned. The Saratoga is quite a rare car, 3,025 were built in 1959 and I believe she is the only running example in NZ, the motor is an exceptionally strong and smooth 383ci RB (Raised block) big block with a long stroke built to replace the Hemi which went out of production temporarily in 1958, she is running a little factory 2 barrel carb so is really easy on the pocket but still maintains huge amounts of torque - towing a 64 Buick over the big hills in the Coromandel Peninsula like it wasn't even there attested to that claim., mechanically the car is totally original apart from a new generation starter motor, exhaust system, brakes rebuilt, alternator fitted and radiator recorded she has recently just turned over 100k miles. Gearbox is the bullet proof cast iron 727 3 speed push button auto and is idiot proof - believe me I've tested it! -- All of the dash and dash pad is original as is the headliner, door panels and seat upholstery, new carpets were installed in NZ. So there she is, definitely a keeper-- Christine and I are looking forward to getting more involved with ACCC and getting many enjoyable South Island miles on the clock......


